CROMWELL Thomas Leonard



Corporal Thomas Leonard Cromwell – 16706
18th Btn. King's (Liverpool) Regiment, Liverpool Pals
Thomas enlisted on 3rd. September, 1914 into Kings
(Liverpool) Regiment. He was quickly promoted so by the
time of the Battle of the Somme he held the rank of
Corporal. He was killed in action at the Battle of
Passchendaele on 18th October 1916 aged 26. His body
was not recovered from the battlefield but he is
commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial.

Thomas was the 9th child of ten of Benjamin and Ann Cromwell. He was born in Cressington Park, Liverpool. His parents retired to Willaston in 1914 and briefly lived at Weston, (now West Dean), 37 Hooton Road prior to moving to The Hollies, Overdale Road.

Other information

Thomas' father had been head gardener at a number of large houses in Liverpool and had lived in Studley Road, Aigburth.

Ann's brother was Jack Turton, a director of Morrison & Son, builders of Liverpool Cathedral.

 the Cromwells lived at Green Bank, Higher Road, Hunt's Cross and Thomas is recorded as being a clerk (Banking).
