Private Arthur Graham - 243937

Arthur Graham enlisted into 10th Battalion Cheshire Regiment, formerly 1547 Cheshire Yeomanry. On 27th April 1918, aged 33, he died in France of wounds received in action with the Cheshire Regiment. He is buried at Longuenesse (St. Omer) Souvenir Cemetery, Pas de Calais, France and is commemorated in Willaston Churchyard (SB4&5). His address in 1918 was Presteigne, Radnor

Arthur was born in 1885 the younger son of James Maclean Graham and Katherine Graham (nee Bushell) of Ty Coch, Mold. He attended Malvern College (House2) from 1898 to 1901. His parents had lived at The Lydiate in 1880.

Other information

Arthur Graham's grandfather was Duncan Graham a wealthy merchant and a generous benefactor to Willaston. He contributed to the building of the church and also of the village school, which was on the Green. He paid for piped water to be laid to the village and arranged for the building of the first vicarage, which was opposite the present one (hence the name of Old Vicarage Road). He died in 1901 having lived at The Lydiate.
