HARRIS Frank



Second Lieutenant Frank Harris was educated at Rossall School and he is commemorated on the plaques in the School Chapel.

He joined the Cheshire Regiment 3rd and 10th Batt. Regimental records note that he was wounded and missing between 3rd -15th July 1916. His death is assumed to be 15th July 1916 aged 28. His body was not recovered but he is commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial and remembered on his parents' grave in Willaston Churchyard. Frank Harris was the son of Thomas and Annie Harris of Willaston. The 1914 Electoral Roll records that they were living in The Shanty, Hooton Road.
