
JONES Harry

Private Harry Jones enlisted into the 1st/4th Btn Cheshire Regiment. He was killed in action aged 28 on 1st August 1918 in France. Harry is buried in the Oulchy-Le-Chateau Churchyard Extension.

He was the son of Charles and Margaret (nee Whitehead) Jones who had four sons and one daughter. They lived at Atworth Terrace, Willaston. His brother, Thomas, was another casualty of the war, dying in 1920, and was buried in Willaston Churchyard. Unlike his brother, Harry is commemorated on the War Memorial. The 1911 Census lists Harry as single and working as a domestic gardener. His father, by this time, was a widower.



OULCHY-LE-CHATEAU CHURCHYARD EXTENSION

Oulchy-le-Chateau is a village 19 kilometres south of Soissons, on the road to Chateau-Thierry. The Churchyard Extension is behind the Churchyard, which is behind the church in the main square.
