Willaston War Memorial

Nigel Pratten attended the meeting to give an update on the money remaining in the Memorial Fund which was established in 2011 when the memorial was damaged and the bronze plaques stolen. Around £5,600 remains in the Memorial Fund which will be kept for any future work needed on the memorial and its surroundings. A representative from WR&CS was nominated for the committee, along with an independent resident and it was agreed that there should be annual feedback about the status of the fund at the WR&CS AGMs.

Land on Smithy Lane and Hadlow Road

WR&CS will be submitting an application to CWaC to claim that this small area of grassland (where the Pollards bike is sited) should be a public right of way based upon usage. If you have regularly walked across it now or at any time in the past, please contact our Footpath's Officer at willastonfootpaths@outlook.com. CWaC are seeking to dispose of this land to a private owner and WR&CS will be putting in an objection to this proposal.



Play Area

The meeting established a sub-committee to take forward community consultation and to raise around £40,000 for the final stage of the play area development. The aim is to install a large climbing unit in 2020.

Christmas Lights

Congratulations to everyone involved in providing the wonderful lights on the beech tree this Christmas – the WR&CS sub-committee, the Hohoho group. The Chase Creative Consultations, Helen Diamond Swimming School, the Methodist Church and the Memorial Hall. Also, congratulations to Willaston and South Wirral Rotary Club for a fantastic inaugural switch-on event. Many people came to look at the dedication book which will shortly be uploaded onto the WR&CS website so that it can be viewed at any time.



Speed Limits

Recently, new speed limits around the village have come into effect. Quarry Road and Hanns Hall Road now are 40mph and Hadlow Road is 50mph. Please respect these new limits. The PCSO is undertaking regular speed checks and recent Community Speedwatch sessions in Neston Road found that 25 vehicles out of 329 exceeded the 20mph speed limit.
