Police Report

Land on Smithy Lane and Hadlow Road

Sue Hunter attended the meeting to tell the committee about their intentions for the grassed area at the end of Smithy Lane which they hope to buy. Their intention is to make it into a garden consistent with the change of use approved in the planning appeal which included strict planning limitations on the land to ensure that it is not fenced off. As a result of this discussion the committee agreed to cease pursuing the application to recognise it as a public right of way. However, we continue to object to the sale of the land as this is a village amenity.



Defibrillator

The Memorial Hall has led on purchasing a defibrillator which will be installed outside the pharmacy. The committee agreed to provide the outstanding £150 towards this installation.
