Key Issues from the meeting held on Monday 23rd January 2020



Bus Services

Several residents attended the meeting to express concern about the loss of the 22 bus service and potential loss of the 272 when the subsidy contract from CWaC runs out on 31st March 2020. We have established a sub-committee to take this forward which included immediately writing to the Council's Leader, Deputy Leader and CEO, along with Justin Madders MP. We will take further steps when we have had a response.





Traffic on Hadlow Road

Our approaches to the Council to reduce the speed limit on Hadlow Road from the T-junction up to the station have been ineffective. As a result, WR&CS will not be doing anything further at this stage.

Play Area

We are very grateful for funding that has been received so far for the final phase of equipment to be installed in the play area, with donations received from many groups and individuals. A full list of donations can be seen on the WR&CS website. We have raised over £10,000 to date and will now be working with the Council to put in a bid to FCC Communities Fund for the remaining money.



We continue to raise concerns with the Council about the poor maintenance of the play area.

Logo

A new logo for the Society has been agreed and will be launched shortly.

McCarthy and Stone Planning Application

We were pleased that the Planning Inspector upheld the dismissal of the planning application by McCarthy and Stone on the former British Legion site. It is possible that McCarthy and Stone will submit a revised application or that an alternative purchaser will be found. We will hold an open meeting to seek the views of all residents on any revised planning application on this site before deciding WR&CS' response.

School Planning Application

Willaston CE School has submitted a planning application to build additional classroom space to run their before and after school care from. This would take pressure off the hall space, which is where the club currently runs, allowing greater flexibility to run after school clubs. There would not be an increase in pupil numbers and will have no impact on the Recreation Ground or car parking.
