
Closure of the Willaston Village Society

The final AGM of the Willaston Village Society was held on 8th February 1951 in the War Memorial Hut. They reported that work on the new tennis courts had been started and a notice board had been erected on the village green. One resident had strongly objected to the design of the noticeboard and taken the matter up with the Council.

The Society had been in existence for 30 years but a newly formed committee, which started as the War Memorial Committee and had become the Memorial Institute Executive Committee had taken over some of the functions of the Village Society and used some of their funds towards improving the hut (which it appears used to be run by the Village Society). Most of the assets were transferred to the new group but the playing cards, ash trays, six tea towels, table cloths and £6 float were given to the Whist Club.

It was agreed that the Caretaker should carry on and the buildings were still available for booking. The main income will be directly from the letting of the buildings.
