Proposed Amendment to the Constitution

These proposed changes relate to Associate Membership & were again discussed by all present. The consensus agreed was that associate membership should be limited to 3 years, they should have same restrictions as full membership, the number of associate members should be capped at 10, with the restriction that only 3 can become officers at any one time. This was put to the vote & agreed by the majority. This will now be taken to the AGM in October for voting.
