Christ Church Reordering Project

Prior to the formal meeting, Viv Ley & Bill Hardman gave us an overview of this project, which is now a fund-raising initiative to allow completion of the refurbishment. Once finished, the refurbished Church will incorporate the facilities of the old Church Hall & will be able to offer numerous new facilities for the entire village to use & enjoy. There will be an Open Day on Sat. 24th Feb. 2024 from 10am - 4pm for all to attend to view the plans & ask questions. Refreshments will be provided.

Looking at the future for WR&CS

Brian G. opened this discussion, looking at where WR&CS fits into the village community, what its strategy is/should be, together with the best form of organisation to take it forward. The current structure & organisation have served it well since its inception almost 50 years ago, however the difficulty of attracting new Officers & the considerable social changes that have occurred over the last few years have meant that we should now take a fundamental look at what we do & how we do it.

To remain as we are, is no longer an option. Many questions were presented this evening & all options must be considered. Professional advice will now be sought to advise us on the best way forward. This topic is an ongoing discussion which will continue at our next meeting.

All Organisation Reps will now take this discussion to their individual groups at their upcoming meetings With comments brought back to the next Committee meeting in March 2024.

Some Committee members felt that there remains a sense of ambiguity as to how residents currently view WR&CS's general principles & objectives; a meeting will now be organised ASAP for a pan-village discussion.

Planning Matters

Brian G. again discussed the current position of WR&CS not having a Planning Officer in place. Brian again thanked Barry V. for supporting the planning role by undertaking relevant background research & completing the planning reports. On Barry V's behalf, Jane T. stressed that Planning matters are a crucial aspect of WR&CS activity & she urged Committee members to at least consider taking on the task of preparation of the monthly planning report. Barry V. had also asked Jane T. to clarify that he was happy to show any interested parties how to access CWaC's planning details & formulate a report.

It seems that the new Green Belt Alliance is no longer in operation.

Jane T. discussed possible fund-raising initiatives to purchase the field off Hooton Road which is the last remaining area dividing Willaston & Hooton. Vicky S. clarified that WR&CS cannot engage in such purchases as we are an unincorporated organisation. This will remain an ongoing point of discussion.

Footpaths & Bridleways / Environmental Group update

No activity with Footpaths at the moment. Monthly litter picking sessions continue & upcoming SUNDAY dates are: 25th Feb, 17th March, 21st April. All 2024 dates are displayed on the notice board.
